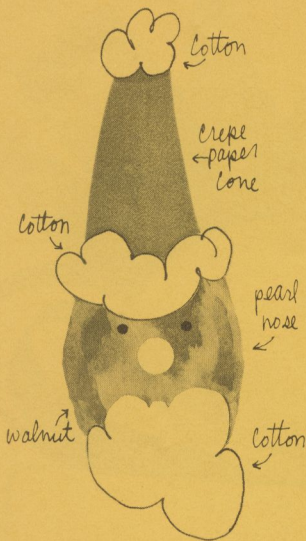
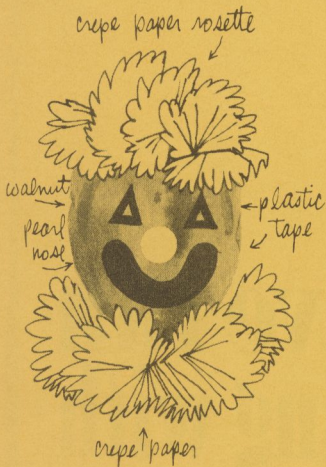

**DIAMOND  
WALNUTS**



**WALNUT SANTA**—Children love this gay St. Nick. You'll need walnuts, red crepe paper, cotton, construction paper, fake pearls, glue.



**FROU FROU THE CLOWN**—Delightful idea for party favors. You'll need walnuts, crepe paper, needle and thread (to fashion ruff and hat), plastic tape, fake pearl, glue.

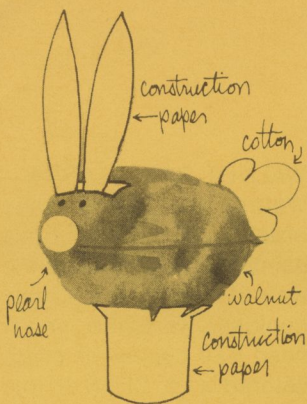
**FOR CHRISTMAS**—Fill your brandy snifter with Diamond Walnuts sprayed in red and green paint (or use poster paints). For other seasons, use pink and gold sprayed walnuts together.



**DOOR SWAG**—Use one large branch of cedar or other greenery as base. Wire in additional branches of cedar and holly. To front of swag, wire strings of Diamond Walnuts and add a big bow with ribbon streamers.

To make strings of walnuts: Using jack knife or similar instrument, force seal of walnut slightly, enough to permit large darning needle and linen thread—or lightweight wire to pass through both ends of walnut. Make strings as long as desired.





**WALNUT BUNNY**—Fun for place-cards. You'll need walnuts, glue, colored construction paper, cotton, fake pearls.

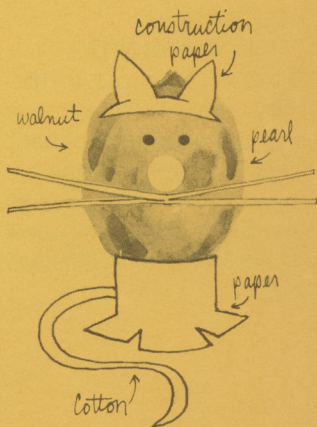


**GIFT CORSAGE** — Two-in-One gift idea! The corsage comes off—and stays pretty indefinitely. We've used wheat and wood roses with walnuts and gum drops. Cover walnuts with cellophane or saran as in centerpiece. Attach wire to foliage and candy; cover wire with florist tape. Trim with a pretty ribbon.

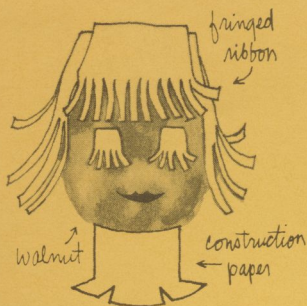


**HARVEST CENTERPIECE**—Build a fabulous centerpiece for a buffet table using fall flowers, dry foliage, and clusters of walnuts.

To make walnut clusters: wrap walnuts in squares of cellophane or saran. Fasten "tails" with #28 wire. Pull together in cluster of desired length, and fasten together with separate piece of wire.



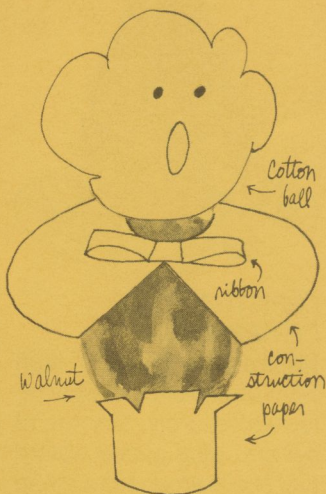
**PUSSY CAT**—Can tell young guests where to sit—go home with them later. You'll need walnuts, construction paper, fake pearls, cotton, glue.



**MISS WALNUT**—Theme for a little girl's party. You'll need walnuts, rayon satin gift ribbon, construction paper, glue.



**HOLIDAY CANDLE**—Wire clusters of Diamond Walnuts (see directions on Harvest Centerpiece) to a "snow" sprayed pine branch. We have made some of our walnuts "acorns" by pressing 2 gumdrop fruit slices around each walnut before wrapping it. Arrange around a tall candle. Trim with more in-the-shell walnuts as desired.



**WALNUT CHOIR BOY**—For a Christmas table. You'll need walnuts, cotton, construction paper, gift ribbon, glue.



**WALNUT FLOWER POTS**—Pretty for a spring table. You'll need walnut half shells, gold paint, pipe cleaners, crepe paper, construction paper, glue.





### CHRISTMAS TREE CENTERPIECE—

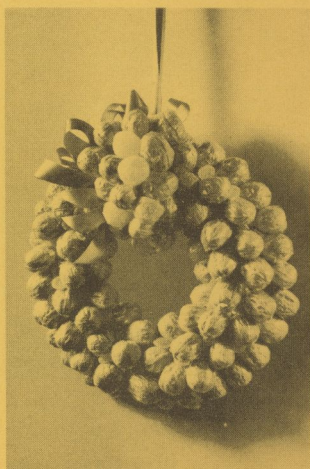
Make a cone about 10" high from screen or chicken wire. Fasten securely. Starting at bottom, glue gilded walnut half shells around in a circle to form "tree." Fill in spaces between each walnut with pink or green crepe paper rosettes. Glue on tiny ornaments if desired. Top with a Christmas ball.

Use in the center of a tray—with inviting whole Diamond Walnuts and a nutcracker so guests can help themselves.

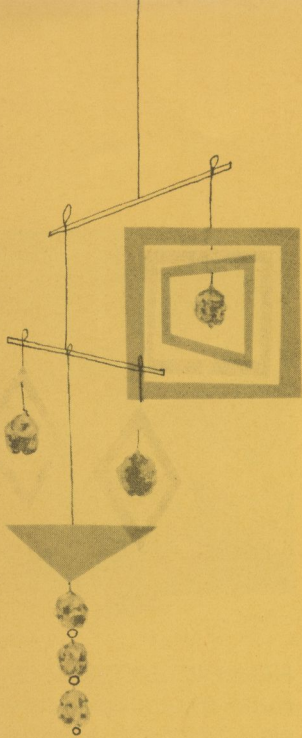
### FORTUNE WALNUTS—

Children will love to find a handwritten "fortune" inside a walnut as a party favor. Crack walnuts carefully, remove meats—insert a "fortune" and glue back together.

Note: This is a novel way to announce an engagement or other surprise at an adult party, too.



**WALNUT HOLIDAY  
WREATH—**You'll need about 2 lbs. of Diamond Walnuts, gumdrops, 9" heavy cardboard circle, #28 wire, cellophane or saran, ribbon. To make, cut squares of cellophane or saran about 2" larger than walnut and candy, wrap around each and fasten "tail" with 6" length of wire. Start wreath by fastening about 20" length of wire to some walnuts. Attach to cardboard—and wrap around circle—wiring in walnuts and candies to form a solid wreath. Trim with ribbon.



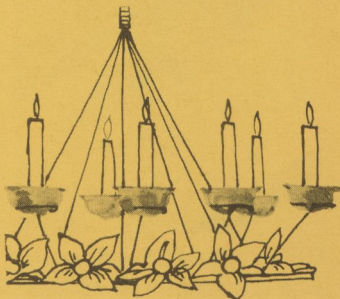
### WALNUT HOLIDAY MOBILE

—Here you can really let your imagination take over. Gild and jewel some whole walnuts—string others together and spray in gay holiday colors. Balance on a mobile form using #28 wire or thread.

### HOW TO BUY DIAMOND WALNUTS:

Diamond Walnuts in-the-shell, are available in one and two pound cellophane bags at grocers. These are the choicest walnuts from the California crop—ideal for decorations—and for eating, too.

**WALNUT CANDELABRA—**Walnut half shells make novel candle holders for this dainty candelabra. (Use the walnut meats for crunchy cookies). To make, you'll need #14 copper or brass colored wire. Cut 8 strips, 15" long. Fasten together at top with an extra piece of wire about 2" long. Bend pieces about 10" down—fan out and make a hook on each end. Gild 8 walnut shells. Fill with melted candle wax and insert a birthday candle in the center of each while wax is still warm. Glue to holder. Secure on a circle of cardboard with plastic tape. Surround with fresh or artificial flowers, if desired.
